



TRADE PARTNER REQUIREMENTS FOR DSCSA COMPLIANCE

As of August 27, 2025, all shipments to Morris & Dickson (M&D) are required to fully comply with Drug Supply Chain Security Act (DSCSA) guidelines as set forth by the U.S. Food & Drug Administration.

M&D is committed to our role as a wholesale distributor in the mission to keep products moving in the secure pharmaceutical supply chain to meet patient needs. As such, M&D will adhere to all standards outlined by DSCSA by the required date(s), including:

Exchange interoperable EPCIS data containing transaction information and transaction statement (2Ts)

- M&D will provide interoperable EPCIS data exchange through our trade partner – [LSPedia](#).
- All trade partners shipping pharmaceutical products to M&D should be connected to our solution provider, LSPedia, and should have tested EPCIS data exchange.
- All trade partners must send EPCIS for all items in shipments to M&D, or provide FDA-approved Waiver.
- M&D must receive EPCIS data for the purchase order prior to the physical receipt of product to our distribution center. Testing is imperative to ensure no disruption to the data exchange or delay in product delivery.
- Review all purchase orders that your organization receives from M&D *AND* verify that all transactional data that you are submitting to M&D includes 100% of your organization's products purchased by M&D.
- Data that is received after the product is delivered to the M&D distribution center is not considered compliant.

M&D Supplier Scorecards

All trade partners that ship products to M&D and are accountable to DSCSA requirements now receive a weekly M&D Supplier Scorecard that is delivered by email. This scorecard provides:

- The number of units/volume of EPCIS-matched product
- The number of units/volume of non-EPCIS-matched product
- Complete list of specific products, by NDC and P.O. number, and EPCIS match status.

Delivery of Aggregated Product

By **August 27, 2025**, M&D will require suppliers that ship product to the M&D Shreveport distribution center to deliver only aggregated shipments. This will require

digital pallet identifiers. Failure to deliver aggregated shipments will result in delays in Receiving Operations due to required scanning of each serialized product.

Failure to comply may result in loss of contract awards, including M&D's Primary Source Generics Program.

Failure to comply with these requirements to ensure proper transmission of EPCIS data by the end of the DSCSA stabilization period may result in disruption of the pharmaceutical supply chain and additional consequences with M&D, including:

- Contract removals in favor of suppliers in compliance, including prime vendor awards on the generic source program
- Delays in receiving, customer deliveries and supplier payments
- Product being quarantined for up to 3 days if EPCIS data is not received. After 3 days and no EPCIS data received, product may be returned at full cost at the expense of the supplier
- Quarantined product may be subject to holding fees
- Enforced Failure to Supply (FTS) penalties due to service level disruptions as called for in M&D supply agreements
- No loss of Contractual fees for misses on Days Inventory On Hand
- FTS penalties that M&D incurs from pharmacies due to delays in receiving will be passed on to M&D suppliers of non-compliant shipments
